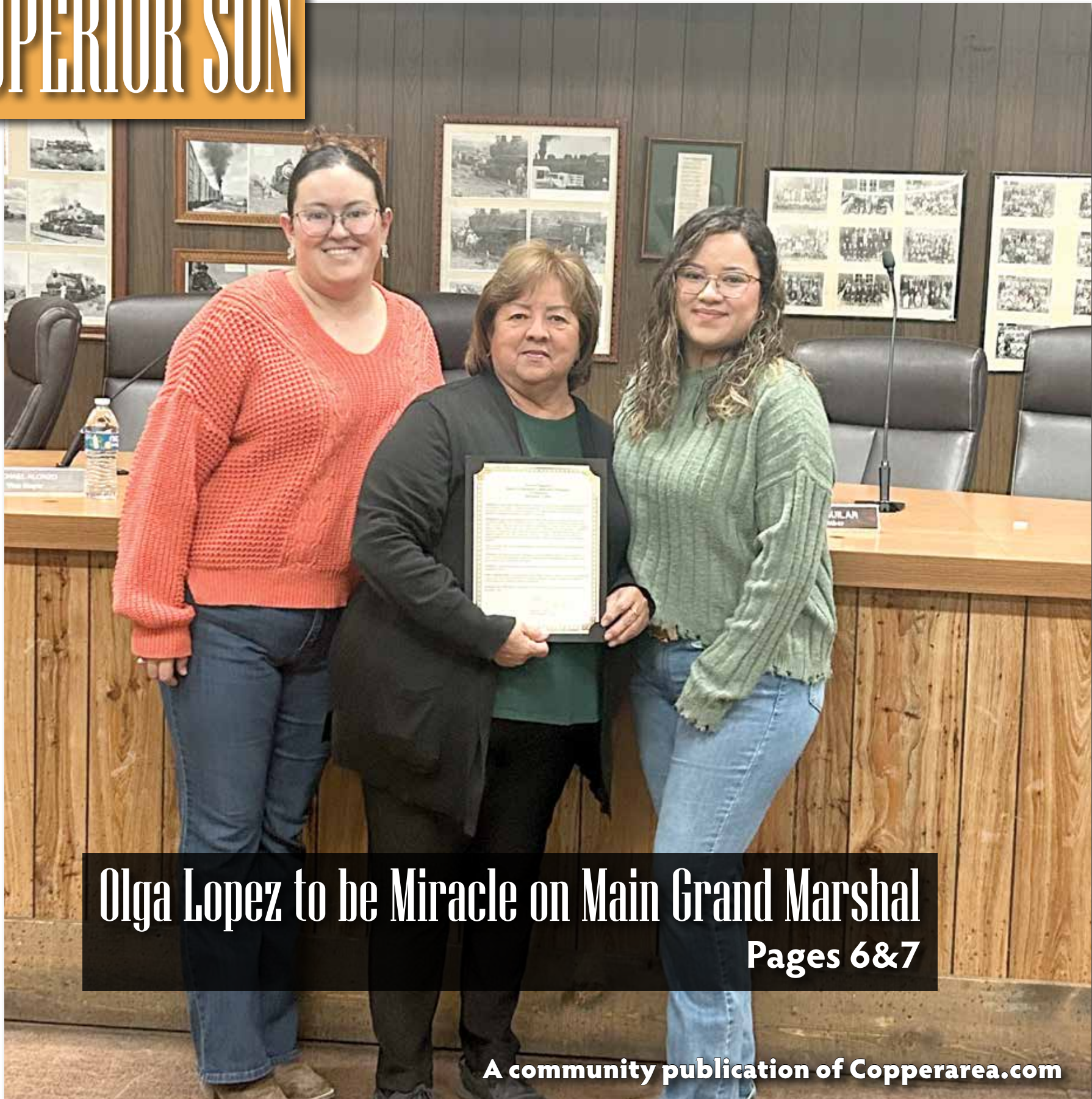
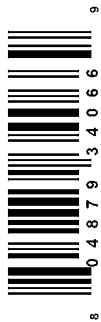

Training course required for off highway vehicle registrations; ADOT MVD partnering with Arizona Game and Fish to offer course online

PHOENIX – Owners registering off-highway vehicles (OHVs) will use AZMVDNOW.gov to take a safety course required by a state law taking effect in January.

The free course, created by Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD), will include content related to the safe operations of these vehicles. The educational course consists of a 10-minute instructional video followed by 20 multiple-choice questions. This course will be required one time for at least one of the OHV owners prior to vehicle registrations or renewals between Jan. 1, 2025, and June 1, 2027.

The Arizona Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Division and AZGFD are partnering to offer this safety course online. Arizona residents will be able to complete the course through AZMVDNOW.gov, the online portal for motor vehicle services in

Arizona as well as MVD office locations across the state. Non-residents will be able to take the course online at AZGFD.gov.

MVD’s online portal is a natural fit to host the training for Arizona residents, as the customer will be able to take the course as well as complete the registration renewal process conveniently and securely in one online location.

The 2025 and beyond OHV decals placed on the vehicle will indicate to law enforcement that the owner has successfully completed the course and the vehicle is legally registered.

If a business has OHVs registered to it, a representative from the business will need to take the course on the business’ AZ MVD Now account.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, PINAL COUNTY, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING THE APPLICATION FOR A LOAN FROM THE GREATER ARIZONA DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Town of Superior, Arizona (the "Town"), has identified a need for certain capital improvement projects relating to streets and flood control (collectively, the "Project"); and **WHEREAS**, in accordance with State of Arizona ("Arizona" or "State") law, the Town may obligate certain excise tax revenues and State shared revenues of the Town as the source of repayment for a loan from the Greater Arizona Development Authority ("GADA"); and **WHEREAS**, the Town certifies that the population of the Town is less than 50,000 persons of the most recent United States Census date; and **WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of the Town to pursue and apply for financial assistance from GADA in an amount not to exceed \$4,000,000 for the Project; and **WHEREAS**, the Town has determined that the Project is in the best interests of its residents. **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, PINAL COUNTY, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The manager, [deputy manager and the finance director] of the Town (collectively, the "Authorized Town Representatives") are each hereby authorized to act on behalf of the Town to apply for financial assistance from GADA.

Section 2. The Authorized Town Representatives are hereby directed to take such actions as are necessary to apply for financial assistance from GADA in an amount not to exceed \$4,000,000, and to identify that loan repayments will be payable from excise tax revenues and State shared revenues of the Town.

Section 3. The Town hereby determines that the Project is in the best interests of the Town's residents.

Section 4. For purposes of an application for financial assistance from GADA, the Town confirms that pursuant to this resolution the excise tax revenues and State shared revenues are committed as the source of loan repayments; provided that the Town, if approved by GADA to receive financial assistance, shall adopt a separate resolution to approve the terms and repayment requirements, and any form of loan agreement to be entered into between the Town and GADA. Furthermore, for purposes of an application for financial assistance from GADA, pursuant to this resolution the Town confirms its intent to pledge State shared revenues as a source of loan repayments, including, as applicable, for such State shared revenues of the Town to be subject to an intercept upon certain events of default to be described in more detail in a loan agreement between the Town and GADA.

Section 5. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, sentence, clause or phrase of this resolution is for any reason held to be illegal or unenforceable, such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this resolution. The mayor and council of the Town hereby declares that they would have adopted this resolution and each and every other section, paragraph, subdivision, sentence, clause or phrase hereof and authorized the execution and delivery of the GADA financial assistance application pursuant hereto irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, paragraphs, subdivisions, sentences, clauses or phrases of this resolution may be held illegal, invalid or unenforceable. All ordinances, resolutions or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith, are hereby waived to the extent only of such inconsistency. This waiver shall not be construed as reviving any ordinance or resolution or any part thereof.

Section 6. 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Rebuild Superior receives EPA grant for \$250K

Local non-profit, Rebuild Superior recently received a \$250,000 grant from the Environmental Protection Agency's Environmental Justice Collaborative Problem Solving Program. Money from

this grant will help fund the continued efforts of revitalizing and cleaning up blighted properties around Superior.

"This work has been done for many years. It is the Blight Busters with the Copper Corridor Economic Development Coalition. They've been working on this. Superior is kind of the leader for the

Brownfields program, and so this is an extension of the work that's been done over the years, mostly directed by Mayor Besich and Todd Pryor," commented Rebuild Superior's executive director Manny Guzman, "That's why we went for these grants, because we were already doing the work, so we were just looking for additional money."

A Brownfield is an abandoned or underutilized property. The Brownfield program aims on cleaning up and reinvesting in those properties, while increasing local tax bases, facilitating job growth, and utilizes pre-existing

infrastructure.

With a lot of ghost houses, and ghost properties in Superior, this grant will help continue to see these places get cleaned up. Some properties might even get redeveloped for commercial or housing depending on how they are zoned, and if the property is viable for use. Even though this grant seems like a lot of money, it is a fraction of what the desired goal will cost. Rebuild Superior is continuing its efforts to find that funding, and investors that want to help make Superior a shining star of the Copper Corridor.

Pediatricians say sharing books with children is the best holiday gift of all

(StatePoint) A book can inspire joy and stir the imagination, and even better this holiday season is the gift of sharing that book with your child.

"Turning the pages of a high-quality, print book filled with colorful pictures and rich, expressive language is best," said Dr. Dipesh Navsaria, a pediatrician. "While touchscreens and other electronic devices may be popular, they are typically passive or solitary experiences for children and do not offer the same benefits of interpersonal connection and relationship building."

Starting from infancy, reading aloud helps build the foundation for healthy social-emotional, cognitive, language and literacy development. Sharing books helps with language development and vocabulary, and gets them ready to listen and learn in school. And over the past decade, research has found that reading together helps foster positive interactions, strengthening the safe, stable and nurturing relationships young children must have to thrive.

The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends reading with your child every day, even if only for a few minutes, and making it part of the bedtime routine. Each evening, set aside 20 to 30 minutes with screens off for sharing books.

Remember that the experience should be fun. You don't have to finish a story if your child loses interest. Let your child choose the book, even if it means reading the same book over and over. You can invite your child to "read" to you from a familiar book that they have memorized. Dr. Navsaria suggests asking about the illustrations or what your child thinks will happen next. You can say: "Can you find all the blue things?" or "Show me all the things that can fly." Point out colors, shapes, numbers and letters and respond with enthusiasm to your child's questions and comments.

Local libraries offer a wide variety of children's literature, including fairy tales,

poetry and nursery rhymes, as well as non-fiction books on subjects children love, such as the ocean or dogs. Follow your child's interests in choosing books. Children's librarians can help you with high-quality book selections on a wide range of topics. And during the holidays, consider building your home library and reinforcing the value of great books by giving them as gifts.

By age 4, a child can typically tell you which books they want to share with you; pretend to read a favorite book aloud to you; and tell you how a story is like things they have seen or done. They may ask you questions about books you are enjoying together or "correct" you if you skip a word or page in a favorite book. As children grow older, reading can help develop character and values that are important to your family. In fact, a really great book has the power to counterbalance negative outside influences and teach children important lessons as they grow.

"It might be a book on kindness after your child experienced or witnessed cruelty," Dr. Navsaria said. "It might be a book on expressing emotions after your child saw or heard scary news coverage, or maybe a book on understanding differences after your child saw someone who looked different than they expected."

The AAP and Reach Out and Read have compiled a list of books—organized by age and topic—to help you raise children who are curious, brave, kind, thoughtful and aware of the world around them. You can find the list at [healthychildren.org](https://www.healthychildren.org).

"Books are great conversation starters," Dr. Navsaria said. "They're also just a lot of fun and can help create wonderful memories, particularly during the holidays when you're spending extra time together. A shared reading experience, as a tender, magical and loving time spent with your child, is truly a gift. It speaks to the heart of what parenting is."
